

## SEND Local Offer

We have high expectations of all our children, and we aim to achieve this through the removal of barriers to learning and participation across all aspects of school life.

Through appropriate curriculum provision, we respect that all children are unique and should have their own personal learning journey through recognising their own worth, working well with others, and becoming increasingly responsible for their own learning whilst becoming resilient, independent, ambitious, and empathetic learners.

Brookfield Primary School believes in developing a strong partnership with parents/carers to enable all children to achieve their full potential. The school recognises that parents/carers have a unique overview of their child's needs and how best to support them, and that this gives them a key role to play in the home-school partnership. Parents/carers hold significant information about their child and have a critical role to play in their child's education and well-being needs.

We aim to:

- enable every child to be happy, healthy, and safe, and be able to form strong relationships.
- enable every child to experience success.
- keep an ongoing register of all children whom we consider to have special educational needs.
- identify children as early as possible, and subsequently assess, record and regularly review their progress and needs, and implement the appropriate provision.
- provide learning interventions targeted to meet individual needs.
- work collaboratively with parents, healthcare professionals and support services.
- ensure that parents and carers can play a key role in supporting their child's education.
- involve the child, where possible, to encourage a move from dependent to independent learning, and allow them to feel fully involved in the provision that supports them.
